

Project Description

The Seward Highway: 36th Avenue Interchange project will improve safety for all transportation modes and reduce delays by constructing a new interchange at the intersection of Seward Highway and 36th Avenue. This intersection is one of the busiest and has the highest crash rate in Anchorage. Bicyclists and pedestrians have reported difficulties crossing the highway and a general lack of east-west connectivity in the area.

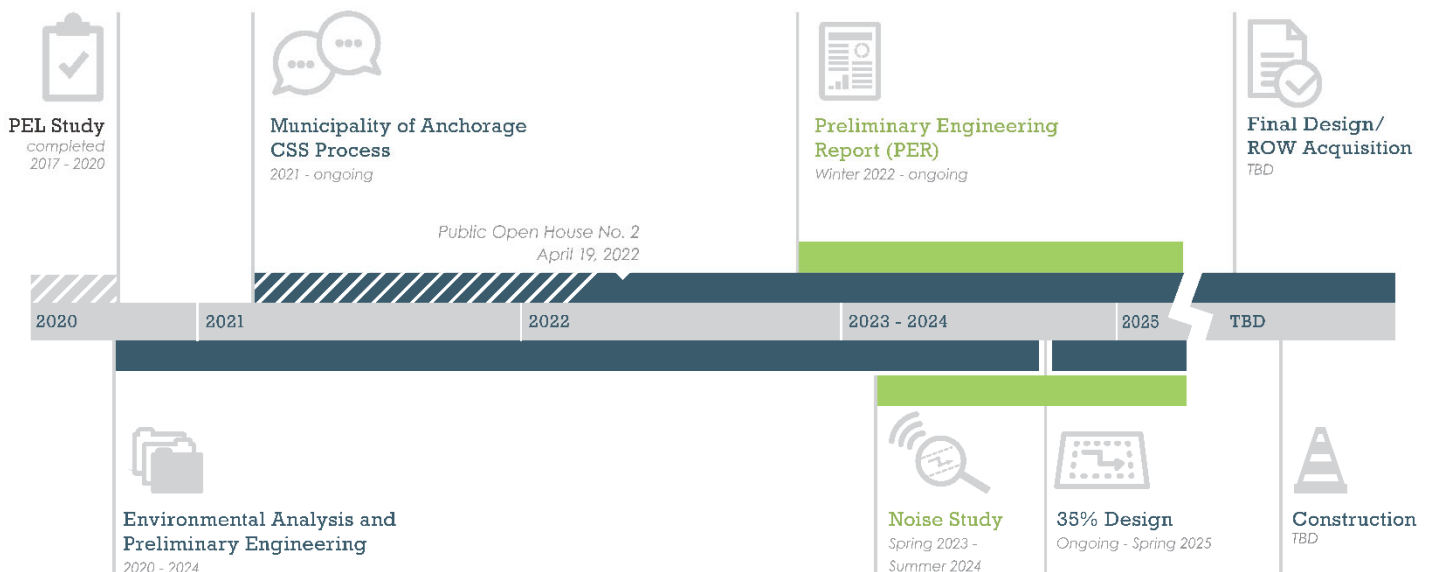
Planned improvements include grade separations, highway ramps, non-motorized facilities, and new frontage roads connecting Tudor Road to 36th Avenue.

This project will increase connectivity by:

- Improving flow for all travel modes
- Supporting the separation of local trips from through trips
- Improving facilities for pedestrians and bicyclists
- Reducing delays and the risk of collisions
