

Project Description

The Seward Highway: 36th Avenue Interchange project will improve and reduce delays for all transportation modes by raising the Seward Highway on a bridge over 36th Avenue. This intersection is one of the busiest and has the highest crash rate in Anchorage. Bicyclists and pedestrians have reported difficulties crossing the highway and a general lack of east-west connectivity in the area.

Planned improvements include grade separations, highway ramps, intersection improvements, and non-motorized facilities, and frontage road(s) where necessary between Tudor Road and 36th Avenue.

This project will increase connectivity by:

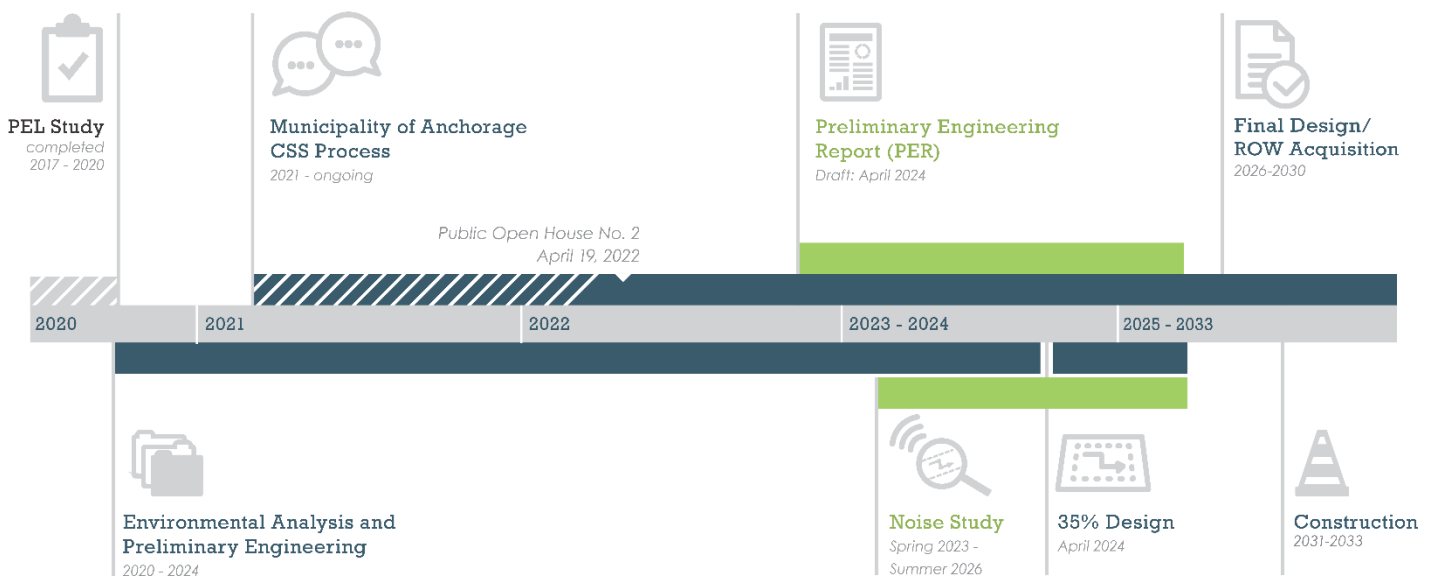
- Improving flow for all travel modes
- Separating local trips from through/regional trips
- Improving and widening pedestrian and cyclist facilities
- Reducing delays and the risk of collisions for all users



Project Status

This project remains active; construction is planned to occur after the Tudor Road interchange is built to minimize travel impacts and avoid overlapping disruptions. The project team is currently working on the interchange design, noise study, cultural and historic resources investigation, and environmental document.
